ORDER OF THE BATH

Instituted in 1399, this distinguished Order of Knighthood fell into decay in the 17th century, but George I revived it in 1725. The Order consists of three classes, each comprising a military and civil division: 1. Knights Grand Cross (GCB); 2. Knights Commanders (KCB); 3. Companions (CB).

the oldest title of honour known to the
British peoples.
